

Understanding your GCSE/AS Level Timetable

Your pack of notes should include the following:

- **JCQ Notices to Candidates for Written and on-screen tests and examinations:** (Green) this outlines important rules and regulations concerning the exams. Read this through very carefully. If you break any of these rules you could be disqualified from all your exams.
- **Notice to Candidates: Coursework Assessments:** (Green) – outline the regulations about coursework.
- **External Examinations Summer 2010:** (Yellow) to be completed and returned by **Monday 22nd February 2010**
- **Contact Details** – (Yellow) so that we can contact you in an emergency once you are on Study Leave.
- **Individual Candidate Timetable – default:** this is a copy of your personal examination timetable, telling you the dates and times for each examination. These dates are fixed by the exam boards (Awarding Bodies) and cannot be changed. **PLEASE CHECK IT THOROUGHLY.** However, please note the following:

TBA: means to be announced. Some exams can be held within a given period when the school decides. The MFL speaking tests will be held over the period 26th April to 7th May. For most of you this will be the first exam. Other practical exams are in Drama and GCSE PE. Media Studies has two controlled tests. These will be timetabled to fit in with the rest of the Summer 2010 timetable.

Clashes: There may be some clashes (exams timetabled at the same time). You will be given more information later on.

Duration: time is in minutes per exam paper.

Higher or Foundation Tier? In MFL exams at GCSE (Edexcel only) you have been entered for Higher and Foundation and you and your teacher will decide which level of paper you will take nearer the time; it does not mean you will be doing both levels. For all other GCSE exams, this decision has already been taken. Please check again that your level of entry is correct. Remember in some exams there is only one level of entry. Still don't understand? Speak to your subject teacher!

GCSE/FC: means a GCSE Full Course (as opposed to a Short Course which is **GCSE/SC**).

Important: If you have been entered for **OCR Nationals in ICT**, this will not show on your candidate timetable as there is no examination.
